The ongoing underfunding crisis is pushing our organization and the people we support to a critical and unsustainable level. We've had to make major reductions to our services and are currently understaffed due to necessary budget cuts just to remain operational.

OUR HOUSE IS ON FIRE

+ 3 MILLION

Dollar deficit again this fiscal year.

Over the past **30** years, our budget has increased by just **4%** while the cost of living has risen by **60%**.

We're closing **2** homes and suspending Community Participation Services for **4** weeks this year.

This is Mary, who lives with her 86-year-old mother and has been on the housing waitlist for **22** years. Guess what? There are another **140** people waiting for a spot.



John attends the Community Participation Support Program, but due to the closures, his mom hasn't been able to go to work for **4** weeks since she is his primary care giver.



Judy loves going swimming, but she hasn't been able to go for **6** weeks because her frontline worker is supporting more than one person due to staff shortages.



CALL TO ACTION

We're concerned about the future of Mary, John, Judy, and the other 900 adults with disabilities we support.

This will impact other sectors such as Long Term Care, Emergency Medical Services, Public Health, Mental and Physical Health, Substance Abuse Treatment, and Social Services, all of which are already at capacity.

We urge MCCSS to fund us to properly meet the real cost of living for each individual, ensuring everyone receives the quality care they need.
